**Scott's Memorial - Christchurch**

Modelled by Lady Kathleen Scott, Captain Scott's widow the statue it was officially unveiled on 9 February 1917. The inscription reads: 'Robert Falcon Scott/Captain Royal Navy/Who died returning from the South Pole 1912/With A.E. Wilson, H.R. Bowers, L.E.G. Oates, E. Evans' and quotes Scott's farewell message: 'I do not regret this journey, which shows that Englishmen can endure hardships, help one another, and meet death with as great fortitude as ever in the past.'

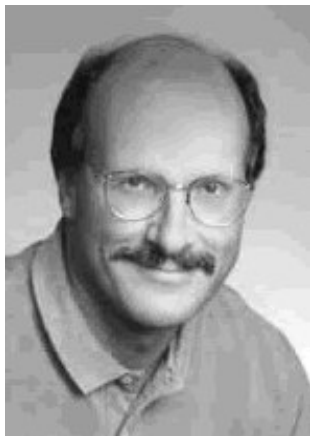
## Directors Notes

His television scripts include *The Comedy Zone*, *Hooters*, *Terra Nova* for BBC-TV, and *The Father Clements Story* which won him the Christopher Award. 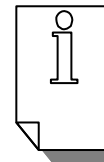
